

Muthur East

JUGA Australia runs after school lessons to improve students' performances in the North East of Sri Lanka.

In 2017, JUGA Australia conducted Tamil, English, Science, Mathematics and History lessons for year 11 students in the Centre for Education (CED) in Kaddaiparichchan. These classes involved 21 students from Kaddaiparichchan Vipulannatha Maha Vidyalayam and Senaiyoor Central College.

As a result of this project, the students who participated performed extremely well in G.C.E (O/L) in 2017.

However, only 43% of students passed their English subject. Subsequently, JUGA Australia will focus more on English in order to improve students' performances in 2018. JUGA's project is highly appreciated by students, parents, teachers and principals in this area. The number of students attended class this year increased from 21 to 55. In 2018, JUGA Australia has also commenced classes for year 10 students in these subjects.


Kokkuththoduvai

Kokkuththoduvai is a village in the Mullaitivu district where resettlement is slowly occurring. In 2016, 100% of the G.C.E (O/L) failed Mathematics. JUGA Australia identified this school as a disadvantaged school and arranged afternoon Mathematics classes in 2017 to help improve student performance.

16 students attended these classes in 2017 and 81% of students passed in 2017 G.C.E (O/L) Mathematics, including 3 students receiving As.

These classes are arranged and monitored by Higher Education And Development Association (HEDA) with JUGA Australia's funding and guidance.



Kumulamunai

Kumulamunai is a village in the Mullaitivu district where their school community desire for their students to achieve the best results in their education. Due to a lack of resources, students are unable to meet their true potential. JUGA Australia identified this school as a disadvantaged school and in 2017 arranged afternoon Mathematics classes to help improve student performance.

32 students attended these classes in 2017 and 81% of students passed Mathematics in 2017 G.C.E (O/L) including 3 students receiving A grades.

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
Alampil

Alampil is a coastal village in the Mullaitivu district where students needed more assistance in their learning. JUGA Australia identified this school as a disadvantaged school and in 2017 arranged afternoon Mathematics classes to help improve student performance.

8 students attended these classes and 87% of them passed in 2017 G.C.E (O/L) including one A grade.

Students were very reluctant to attend classes and those who attended classes performed very well in 2017 G.C.E (O/L). Encouragement from their principal and teachers helped to ensure student attendance and led to improved results.

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
Students are struggling to regularly attend this program as they often have commitment to contribute their family income. However, student attendance for classes in 2018 has significantly improved. In 2018, JUGA Australia implemented afternoon science classes as per school request.

Chilawaththai

Chilawaththai is a village in the Mullaitivu district where students need more assistance in their learning. In 2016, only 22.3% of students passed Mathematics in G.C.E (O/L). JUGA Australia identified this school as a disadvantaged school and in 2017 arranged afternoon Mathematics classes to help improve student performance.

26 students attended these classes and 58% of them passed Mathematics in 2017 G.C.E (O/L) with two students receiving 2 A grades.
